Helping young people realise their potential, encouraging them to explore their post 16 and post 18 options.



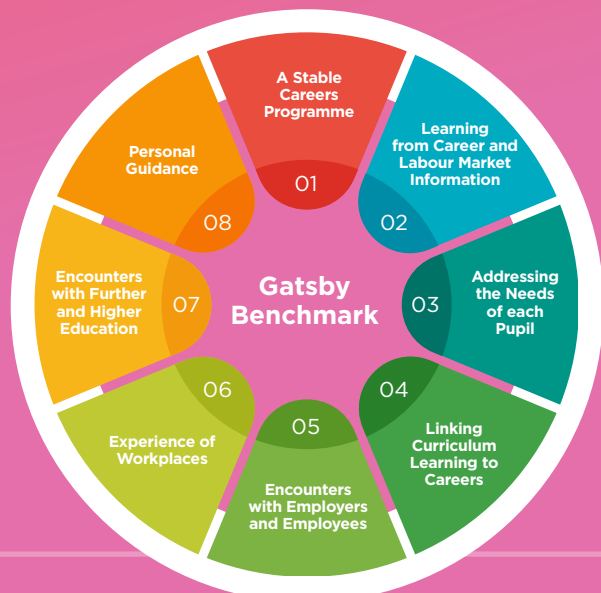
### Personal Development
