This highly sought-after title recognises the exceptional level of assistance the College provides to some of the most vulnerable learners seeking sanctuary in the city.

Our Adult Skills department has been praised for its hard work ensuring an outstanding support package is always available, offering help with new skills for employability, wellbeing, and cultural inclusion.

The region receives around 13% of the UK's Asylum Seekers, and migration data shows Bradford to be one of four locations to receive the highest proportion of these individuals.

Supporting just one Refugee/Asylum Seeker student in 2010, Bradford College has now helped nearly 2,000 and is one of the largest support providers in the UK.



You must enrol in order to be admitted to class. If you have missed the course start date the Adult Skills team can enrol you as a late joiner. For fee payable courses you will be expected to pay the full fee amount.



### Funding options

#### Funding provides learners with more opportunities to learn and upskill.

So many of our courses could be free for you; we access local, regional, and national funding resources to make sure learning is more accessible to adults in Bradford than ever before

We also offer a wide range of bursaries and grants, there's adult learning loans and the 'Free Courses for Jobs' incentive that unlocks free qualifications in a range of professions.

#### **Maths and English**

If you are aged 19+ and do not have a GCSE in Maths and/or English at Grade 4/C, you will receive full fee remission.

#### Low income fee remissions

You may not have to pay for your course (on selected courses only) if:

- You are an employed/self-employed learner earning less than £21.305
- You are in receipt of JSA/ESA. Universal Credit. Carer's Allowance. or **Employment Support**
- You are an asylum seeker and have been in the UK for more than six months.

#### Free courses for jobs

Your course might be covered under Free Courses for Jobs if:

- You are aged 19+ at the start of your Level 3 course and currently don't hold a full Level 3 qualification
- You are aged 19+ at the start of your course and studying an additional Level 3 and meet any of the fee remission criteria above.

#### Free flexible learning courses

All our Level 2 flexible learning courses and some of our Level 3 flexible learning courses are free for everyone living in the West Yorkshire region aged 19 or above.

#### Full fee payable courses

Our standard Community Courses cost £60. However some courses are provided by third parties which means you have to pay the full fee. We are unable to waive fees on these courses or provide discounts.

If you wish to study a full-time course at Level 3 or above, you may be eligible for an Advanced Learner Loan to cover the cost of your course.

### Important information

#### **Payment methods**

You must pay fees in full at the time of enrolment. Annual payments will be made for courses of more than one year in duration. You may be able to pay in instalments. You can pay by credit/debit card or cash in the David Hockney Building, or by bank transfer.

#### **Employer/sponsor paying**

If your employer is paying for your course fees please provide a letter on company letterhead stating the course and fee your employer is paying.

#### Non-payment of fees

You may be withdrawn from your course if you do not pay your tuition fees.

#### **Refunds**

Full refunds will automatically be given where courses do not run. Refund of tuition fees, once the course has started, will only be approved in exceptional circumstances. The College will not refund any portion of a student loan that you have taken out to cover your course fees.

If you choose to leave a course within 42 calendar days of the course start date, you will not receive a refund but will not be expected to pay the remainder of tuition fees.

Please note our refund policy does not apply for full fee payable courses.

#### 16-18-year olds

Students aged 16-18 years old are not required to pay course fees on most full-time study programmes.
